What is therapeutic engagement?

- Therapeutic engagement involves healthcare professionals spending quality time with service users, aiming to empower them to participate in their care
- Therapeutic engagement is seen as a very important aspect of mental health nursing and care
- It is believed to lead to improved outcomes and experiences for service users

Development of the TEQ – why we did it

Before the development of the therapeutic engagement questionnaire (TEQ) there was no way to objectively:

- measure the contribution of registered mental health nurses to mental health service users' recovery
- assess the impact of therapeutic engagement in acute inpatient mental healthcare settings – both across the ward and in 1:1 interactions between service users and nurses

Development of the TEQ – why we did it

- To determine the nature of therapeutic engagement on service users' experience (as viewed by service users)
- To examine therapeutic engagement from the perspective of registered mental health nurses (as distinct from other professionals)

Development of the TEQ – How we did it

The TEQ was developed in partnership with service users and mental health nurses in three stages:

Stage 1. Working out what the questionnaire was going to assess and how ('item generation')

Stage 2. Reducing and agreeing on the number of aspects of care and engagement to be assessed ('factor analysis')

Stage 3. Checking how the results of the TEQ compared with other established questionnaires (authentication)



The TEQ – what it looks like

- 20 item questionnaire; two sub-themes/scales (1:1 care interactions, care environment and ward atmosphere)
- 1 to 4 tick box response (using the Likert scale)
- Behaves well as a measurement; determines the nature of therapeutic engagement on service users' experience (as viewed by service users)
- Examines therapeutic engagement from the perspective of registered mental health nurses (as distinct from other professionals)

Implementation of the TEQ – where we are

- Implemented in adult acute wards of four NHS Mental Health Trusts in England – three others in process
- An independent provider has also implemented the TEQ in the acute wards of three mental health hospitals
- Implemented in Finland, Malta and Slovenia

Implementation of the TEQ – its value

Implementation has demonstrated the value of TEQ in:

- highlighting the role of registered mental health nurses in therapeutic activity
- identifying variations in practice across wards.

The outcome data produced by TEQ are being used in a variety of ways to:

- support the nursing strategy
- inform the quality improvement strategy
- introduce new ways of working enhancing the quality of service user experience and nurses' job satisfaction

What has the TEQ impacted on care in practice?

- Intensive engagement between service users and nurses
- 1:1 therapeutic engagement between senior staff and service users, role modelling good practice to junior staff
- Getting the induction and admissions process right from start, so that both patients and staff are working together

Future use of the TEQ

- An additional NHS Mental Health Trust will be implementing the TEQ on wards for young people
- TEQ is due to be implemented in Jordan later this year, as well as other countries
- We are planning to develop an app-based TEQ
- We are looking at how to implement the TEQ in different care settings beyond mental health
